OUR SERVICES

PHYSIOTHERAPY*

The Physiotherapist works with children and youth and their families to enhance mobility, improve physical function and positioning and utilize adaptive equipment through assessment, exercise programs and play.

OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY*

The Occupational Therapist supports children and youth to function at their best in the roles that they perform daily (i.e., hygiene, feeding, dressing and writing). The Occupational Therapist will assist in the areas of self-care activities, play and leisure and the utilization of adaptive equipment.

SPEECH-LANGUAGE THERAPY*

The Speech-Language Pathologist provides assessment, consultation and treatment planning to assist children and youth in achieving their optimum potential in all areas of speech and language: communication, cognition and swallowing.

SOCIAL WORK*

The Social Worker provides information, education, support and counselling to assist children, youth and their families to live more successfully with their special needs.

THERAPEUTIC RECREATION*

The Therapeutic Recreationist works with community partners to identify, plan and implement leisure opportunities for children and youth with special needs. This service promotes social inclusion as a key component of an individual's quality of life.
